

Judges 1-2





The Israelites were to possess the land and destroy the altars where the people of Canaan worshipped idols. The Israelites did not drive out the wicked people of Canaan as God commanded. The Israelites decided to live with their Canaanite neighbors. Then the Israelites started worshipping the Canaanite idols. God was angry. He said, "I will not drive the Canaanites out of the land."







Each of the twelve tribes of Israel Sea of Galilee





The account of the judges is not necessarily a chronological record of everything that happened during this period. There is some overlapping of time periods with one judge possibly ruling in one area of Israel while another one is in a different region. This may account for the lack of information we have concerning several of the judges who are barely mentioned by name. In this lesson we will note the references to these little-known judges. They were not necessarily less important, but we just don't know very much about them.
