As we begin our look at the kings and prophets of the divided kingdom, we will notice the differences and similarities between **Israel** and **Judah.** We will see that **Israel's** kings are, for the most part, all wicked, disobedient to God and lead their kingdoms into idolatry. **Judah**, on the other hand, will have several good kings who turn the people back to serving the true God. **Israel** and **Judah** will continue to be enemies with each other throughout this period. We will also look at several prophets who interacted with the kings in each area. Most of them gave the same warning to the kings: "Return to God or you will be judged." Most of the kings, however, will refuse to listen to the prophets and eventually lead their people to certain disaster.

Hosea was a prophet who spoke to the kingdom of **Israel** during this period from Jereboam II to Hoshea. (II Kings 14-17). He warned them that they would be judged by God for their disobedience. Eventually, the kingdom of Israel was captured by the Assyrians just as Hosea had warned. Hosea saw the end of the kingdom in his lifetime. His prophecies came true.

Jonah 1-4





Isaiah lived during the time when the northern kingdom of **Israei** was captured by the Assyrians. He saw God's protection of **Judah**, the southern kingdom, from the Assyrians during the reign of Hezekiah, but he knew **Judah** would someday fall to the Babylonians. He did for **Judah** what Joel, Hosea and Amos did for **Israel**. His ministry lasted about forty years. Isaiah also speaks of the coming Saviour,






