
As we begin our look at the kings and prophets of the divided kingdom, we will notice the differences and similarities between Israel and Judah. We will see that Israel's kings are, for the most part, all wicked, disobedient to God and lead their kingdoms into idolatry. Judah, on the other hand, will have several good kings who turn the people back to serving the true God. Israel and Judah will continue to be enemies with each other throughout this period. We will also look at several prophets who interacted with the kings in each area. Most of them gave the same warning to the kings: "Return to God or you will be judged." Most of the kings, however, will refuse to listen to the prophets and eventually lead their people to certain disaster.

Elijah And Wicked King Ahab



God will send several prophets to warn the people to turn away from their idolatry and return to serving Him. God will allow an enemy to capture and eventually destroy the nation of Israel. God sends several prophets to warn the people, but they will not turn from their idols.


Hosea was a prophet who spoke to the kingdom of Israel during this period from Jereboam II to Hoshea. (II Kings 14-17). He warned them that they would be judged by God for their disobedience. Eventually, the kingdom of Israel was captured by the Assyrians just as Hosea had warned. Hosea saw the end of the kingdom in his lifetime. His prophecies came true.


