Good: Respecting parents, prayer, desire for scripture, worship, love. Bad: anger, shouting, jealousy, plotting/cheating. Color and glue clip art on the sheets

Review: God sees what is inside our hearts, not the outside. Love/obey/pray with whole heart. Be thankful/remember wonderful things.

Coloring sheet: Samuel anoints David

Explanation of Craft:

Craft 1: Get out sheets, one half labeled Put In Our Heart and one half labeled Get Out of our Heart. Hand out pieces and talk about what goes on each sheet.
